To this end, we invite you to participate in our breastfeeding-friendly designation program by confirming your business's adherence to the following criteria:

- All staff are advised to welcome breastfeeding mothers and provide a comfortable and supportive environment for breastfeeding.
- Your business will not tolerate discrimination or harassment of breastfeeding mothers on the premises.
- Your business allows flexibly regarding seating arrangements and time limits to accommodate breastfeeding mothers and their babies.
- Your business *may* offer privacy options, such as discreet seating or nursing areas, for breastfeeding mothers who prefer a more private space. Staff can guide mothers to these areas upon-request.

By meeting these criteria, your business will be eligible to receive our breastfeedingfriendly designation, which includes the display of a sticker in your business front window indicating your support for breastfeeding families as well as being published in our list of "breastfeeding-friendly" local enterprises.
