PATI Information Statement

Name of Public Authority: DEPARTMENT OF ENERGY

Introduction:

The Public Access to Information Act of 2010 not only grants the public the statutory right to access information about how its government operates but also affirms the Government's obligation to provide information upon request. In an effort to be as transparent as possible in its operations, the Department of Energy issues this statement to provide insight into its operations, services, and obligations to the public. The information provided includes operating procedures, documents that govern the Department's decision-making processes, and general information about its day-to-day activities.

Please note that, despite its name, the Department of Energy is now responsible for Broadcasting, Telecommunications, Space, and Satellite matters, following its merger with the Department of Telecommunications in 2018.

Section B: 1) Functions, powers, duties of the Authority [s5(1)b]

Powers of the Department of Energy

Under section 11 of the Electricity Act 2011 and section 6(2) of the Telecommunications Act 1986, the Director supports the Minister responsible for Energy and Telecommunications in the discharge of his duties according to those Acts.

Duties of the Department of Energy

The Department of Energy develops policy, legislation and regulation to promote, advocate and develop policy and legislation for the Energy, Telecommunications, Space and Satellite industries. The Department is primarily a policy-making department, which also provides public education and outreach on those sectors. The Director reports to the Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Home Affairs.

The duties of the Department also include inspecting telecommunications and radio facilities in relation to any Broadcasting functions, collecting fees from Broadcasters, maintaining the license database, and administering new licenses and renewals. The Department is responsible for the administration of the Broadcasting and Telecommunications Commissions as well.

Section B: 2) Obligations under PATI Act [s5(1)b]

To provide an **information statement** for the public and promulgate it [s5],

- To provide **other information** to the public so that the public needs only to have minimum resort to the use of the Act to obtain information [s6]. This includes:

- General information, e.g. activities of the Authority
 - Log of all information requests and their outcome
 - Quarterly expenditure (upon request) [s6(5)]
 - Contracts valued at \$50,000 or more.
- To **respond to information requests** in a timely manner [s12-16]
- To **track information requests**, and provide this data to the Information Commissioner
- To respond to requests from the Information Commissioner [s9]
- To **amend personal information** held by the Authority that it is wrong or misleading following a written request by the person to whom the information relates [s 19]
- To conduct an **internal review** if formally requested [part 5]
- To give evidence for **review by the Information Commissioner** [part 6, 47(4)], or for **judicial review** [s49], if required
- To provide an **annual written report** to the Information Commissioner of the status of information requests [s58 (3)].
- To **do anything else as required** under the PATI Act and subsequent Regulations [s59, 60], including:
 - **Fees** for Requests for information
 - Management and maintenance of **records**
 - **Procedures** for administering the Act
- To **train staff and make arrangements** so as to facilitate compliance with the Act [s61]
- To **designate one of its officers** to be the person to whom requests are directed [s62]

Section C: Services and Programmes [s5(1)c]

Services:

The Department of Energy provides the following services:

- Ongoing development and support of policies, programmes and legislation to support the goals of the White Paper 2011.
- Technical support to the Ministry and other departments for matters under its remit.
- Development and support for internal policies and initiatives to enable the Public Service to lead by example in the areas of energy conservation, efficiency and the adoption of renewable and alternate energy technologies.
- Consultation to other Departments for all energy, broadcasting and satellite matters
- Management of the Broadcasting and Telecommunications Commissions
- Management of the filing and coordination of satellite networks through Bermuda
- Collection of data for the International Telecommunications Union from industry
- Management of licenses and complaints in the Broadcasting sector

Programmes:

The Department is tasked primarily with the implementation of policies in the Energy, Telecommunications and Space Sector, which have included rebate programmes, outreach and education initiatives like summer camps for students, conferences and Public Service Announcements. The Department of Energy is currently carrying out the LED Initiative, which is distributing LED light bulbs to all households in Bermuda.
