Note: Three (3) years required for persons applying under section 18(2) of the British Nationality Act, 1981 and five (5) years required for persons applying under section 18(1) of the British Nationality Act, 1981.

6. Police report, with the applicant's full name, from country of origin. (*The police report from the applicant's country of origin is **not** needed if, at the date of application, the applicant has resided in Bermuda for fifteen (15) years or more.*)
